IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR TEAMS ABOUT THE ONTARIO LACROSSE FESTIVAL

Earlier today, the Durham Region announced emergency repairs related to a water main that will affect roads surrounding Iroquois Park Sports Centre during the 2017 Ontario Lacrosse Festival.

A section of Victoria Street located west of Iroquois Park Sports Centre will be closed (from Halls Rd to Seaboard Gate). This area will be closed from August 4 – 6th, 2017.

Additionally, a section of Victoria Street located east of Iroquois Park Sports Centre (Thickson Rd. intersection) will also be closed. This area will be closed beginning August 4th for an indeterminate amount of time.

The only access available to Iroquois Park Sports Complex from Highway 401 will be Brock Street (exit 410 from Highway 401). This will likely create additional traffic delays for those traveling to and from Iroquois Park.

The Ontario Lacrosse Association advises participants to leave plenty of time when traveling within this area in order to avoid anticipated traffic delays. The Festival team will continue to monitor this situation for additional information. About the Ontario Lacrosse Festival:

Launched in 2004, the Ontario Lacrosse Festival is the event name of a ten-day lacrosse promotional event hosted in the Durham Region of Ontario. The Ontario Lacrosse Festival hosts 522 teams and over 10,000 athletes, featuring competition in 44 provincial and national lacrosse championships for minor box and women's field lacrosse athletes. With an estimated attendance of 55,000 people, the Ontario Lacrosse Festival is the largest youth lacrosse event in North America.
