CALL TO ORDER:

**Mr. Miller asked if Doug Luey would resign his current position as Commissioner of the MSL. Mr. Luey stated that the elections for the MSL have not taken place as of the AGM. Mr. Miller then informed him as per the OLA Bylaws you could not hold two Board positions at the same time. Mr. Miller had a sidebar with Dr. Drew Girard for further discussion. Mena Briscoe then asked Mr. Miller where this was written and Mr. Miller informed her it is clearly stated in the OLA Bylaws as per B6.15. The President elect does not take office until after the conclusion of the AGM. As per B6.15, the President would be expected to resign from the Commissioner's role ASAP after completion of the AGM.
