TORONTO, ON – February 26th, 2022 – After more than 40 years, Ontario Women's Field Lacrosse (OWFL) is excited to announce its new branding ahead of the 2022 season. The announcement is part of a bold new chapter for the league, as it continues to support growth and development opportunities for girls and women of all ages to play women's field lacrosse in Ontario.

As part of its rebranding announcement, the OWFL has published its new league logo, which features the silhouette of a female player bursting through the familiar but updated outline of the trillium, representing the league's reach throughout the province.

"We're really proud to share our new logo with our players. After missing much of the previous two seasons, our strength and passion is on full display for 2022, with new programs and a new look that really speaks to the strength and power of our athletes," stated Yvonne Harding, OWFL Commissioner.

The 2022 regular season is set to kick off beginning on the weekend of May 28/29, with the league examining options for warm-up tournaments to be scheduled in the lead-up. The regular season, comprised of ten consecutive weekends, will result in a full schedule for the participating teams, weather permitting. Clubs will also be able to schedule midweek exhibition games, subject to league rules regarding notification.

This year also marks the return of the U17 Ontario Summer Games, which is a fantastic opportunity for OWFL players to showcase their talent at the highest level of play. Try-outs for the Ontario Summer Games, a multi-sport event which takes place between July 21st – 24th in Mississauga, ON, will be held on May 14th – 15th in Guelph and are open to athletes born between 2006 and 2009. Team Ontario planning is also well underway, with try-outs set to begin in April for its U15, U17 and U19 provincial and development teams.
